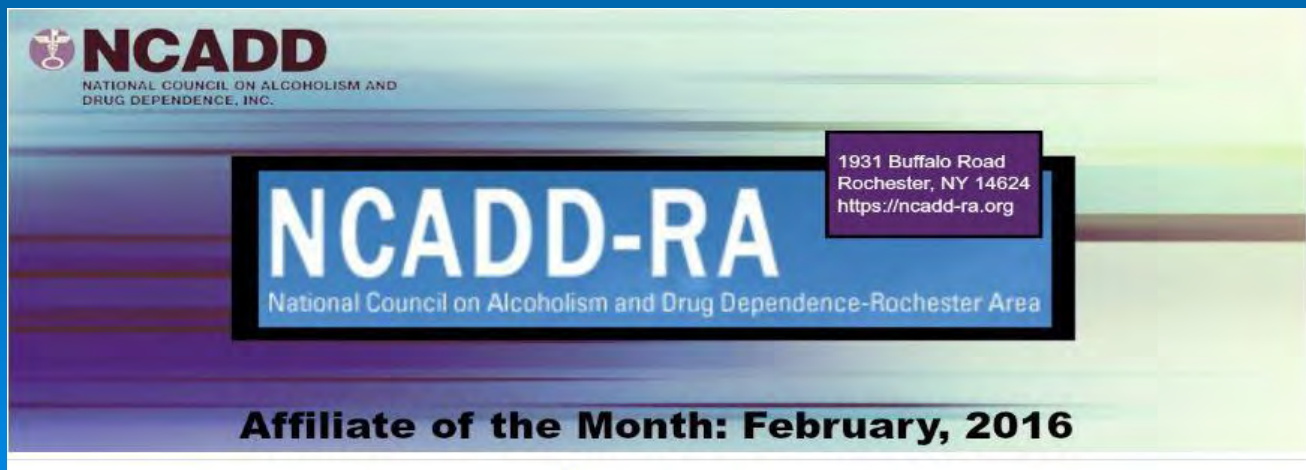


# 2016 NCADD-RA Staff awards/recognition!
