The National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence–Rochester Area offers a comprehensive, 16-month Addictions Counselor Credential Training (ACCT) program for individuals seeking the New York State OASAS Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor (CASAC) designation.

The ACCT program provides the 350 education hours required by the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services for the CASAC. All classes are held Tuesdays and Thursday evenings at NCADD-RA — making the program easily accessible to those who work full-time.

Candidates must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Demonstrate writing, communication skills and counselor aptitude
- Have a high school diploma or equivalent
- Complete the program's screening process

Internship Component

Students have an opportunity to meet local treatment providers to engage in an internship. Hours vary with students' level of experience and highest degree in a relevant field. The treatment provider oversees the clinical training and practical skills of the student intern.
